


Web Content Portlet

Search by Author: Search for web content articles based on author name




• Sort Web Content articles by Author Name – Sort the displayed list of articles by clicking the "Author" tab available on the Web Content portlet.




Latest Article Displayed via Web Content portlet Search

Web Content Display (Configuration2)


In the new portal clicking the "Configuration2" option or trying to select a web content (to be displayed via web content display portlet) displays the page with a list of available web content articles as a pop up. Navigate back to the portlet by clicking the "x". The page title shall display "Web Content Display-Configuration2" or based on any title created by user the page shall display "TitleName-Configuration2".




Removal of Personal Folder

Personal folder has been removed in the new portal from the list of folders displayed under "Resource Type -> Document" via WYSIWIG editor, since any document uploaded to the editor's personal folder cannot be linked to any page. (Ignoring this folder was not intuitive for the editors.)

Personal Folder has been removed from the New Portal




Structure and Template

A Structure creates a structure editor for content creators that includes "Form Controls";

A template is created to display that content in a consistent repeatable manner

Structure Editor easily adds and removes fields you want to make available to content creators and then dynamically move them around. This editor includes an entire suite of Form Controls that can be dragged and dropped onto the structure.

Existence of a structure shall provide a drop down with the available list of structures while adding web content. This feature shall enable adding web content based on a particular available structure.

Load More Results Option



Documents and Media

Document History

The current document is displayed as part of the document's history. The document history also displays who uploaded the document.



Static Link

Document and Media supports static URLs. If a file is moved from one folder to another folder, the old URL can still be used to download the document though with the moving of the document to another folder, a new URL shall be created. The user shall be able to download the document via the new URL as well as the old. Although, while moving a file from one folder to another the old URL is replaced with a new, it remains unchanged if they exist as part of an already published web content, existing documents or any email previously sent out with it.
